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MEDICAL TERMINOLOGY COURSE

Please read through the information below for the **Medical Terminology pre-course** which runs from **Monday, July 4, 2022** to **Saturday, August 13, 2022**.

Also! Do refer to the "Mandatory Hardware" section to ensure you meet all submission deadlines for materials requested prior to the program.

MEDICAL TERMINOLOGY PRE-COURSE

The Medical Terminology pre-course will help to familiarize you with Quercus (CanvasTM), the Learning Management Engine that is used at the University of Toronto. Although the course is self-directed, there will be a Course Director who will set up designated times for the class to meet (virtually) to discuss the material.

To participate in the course, there are a number of steps to follow (see below). Please leave yourself enough time to complete these steps in advance of the start date.

1. Purchase the course code

The Medical Terminology pre-course access code is available online from the <u>University of Toronto</u> Bookstore.

Each student must purchase their own access code in order to participate in the course. You do not require the textbook, just the access code. For quicker access, you may ask the Bookstore to email you with your course code once they receive it. Otherwise, they will mail it to you. Please note that the additional cost for shipping is dependent on the delivery location. Please allow at least 1 week for delivery. You will need to communicate with the Bookstore on this process.

• Please note that a headset, microphone, and webcam are used as part of the synchronous online meetings in the Medical Terminology pre-course.

2. Email your access code to the BScPA Program at physician.assistant@utoronto.ca

Once the BScPA Program office receives your access code, we will email your qq code and password so that you can access the course online (our online learning environment is called "Quercus").

The qq code is temporary and provides access to the Medical Terminology course and the PA Program shell only. The qq code will **NOT** provide access to the BScPA Program courses, nor will it provide full access to the library system. If you already have a UTORid, you must still use the qq code provided to you by the BScPA Program as only the qq code will allow access to the Medical Terminology Course.



3. Access the Medical Terminology Course

- a) Access the University of Toronto on-line learning site (Quercus) https://q.utoronto.ca
- b) Log-in with your assigned qq code and password **do NOT use your UTORid**.
- c) Click on your course "Medical Terminology" under "Courses."
- d) For tips on how to use Quercus, click on the "Help" icon while logged in to Quercus.

**It is the responsibility of the student to ensure all payments are completed on time.

Fee Invoice and Payment Installments

Log in to ACORN using your JOINid and password. In ACORN, you can view the details of your account by clicking on the "Financial Account" tab on the left side of the screen. You will see the balance on your account and your account activity.

Refund Schedules

Deadlines for tuition refunds and withdrawal fees (if leaving the program) for the 2022-23 academic year will be available by mid-July at https://studentaccount.utoronto.ca/tuition-fees/.

Financial Aid Information: OSAP (Ontario Student Assistance Program)

As noted in your Letter of Offer Terms and Conditions, the BScPA Program is recognized by OSAP https://osap.gov.on.ca/OSAPPortal/en/Home/index.htm. It is possible that students enrolled in the BScPA program may qualify for a fee deferral from the Student Accounts office if awaiting OSAP support. If you qualify for OSAP funding, deferral of fees must be requested (by selecting the Fee Deferral Option in ACORN) by August 29, 2022.

Scholarships at U of T

- <u>Canadian Federation of University Women Etobicoke Bursary</u> open to female students who live in Etobicoke.

 - * We advise that you obtain two hard copies of the Vulnerable Sector report. As this can take longer to complete, the program is more flexible with this deadline.

Note: If any submissions have not been received by the deadline, the BScPA Program reserves the right to revoke the offer of admission to the BScPA Program. Please contact the PA Program office in advance if you are unable to meet the deadlines.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

1) Vulnerable Sector Police Records Check and Disclosure (due by September 15, 2022)

As noted in the Terms and Conditions of your offer letter, your offer of admission requires that you provide a Vulnerable Sector Police Records Check and Disclosure. This process must be initiated through your local police service. Costs incurred will be at your own expense. Police forces may use slightly different language to describe the various levels of Records Checks available. Your check must include results from local police records, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police's (RCMP's) Canadian Police Information Centre, and the Pardoned Sex Offender Registry. As these checks can take up to 12 weeks in some centres, we recommend that you begin the process as soon as possible to ensure compliance with our deadline.

We advise that you obtain two hard copies of your report. Retain one copy for your personal files. We will ask that you submit the other copy to the PA Program during the September In-Person Campus Block. In the meantime, please submit the report electronically by September 15, 2022 to your personal OneDrive link.

Should you have concerns about the Vulnerable Sector Police Records Check, please contact the Physician Assistant Program office by email at physician.assistant@utoronto.ca.

Please note that the Toronto Police Services Vulnerable Sector Screening process takes 2-4 weeks to complete. If you will be using Toronto Police Services to obtain this record check, please attend to the following:

2) Immunizations Form (August 12, 2022)

As noted in your Letter of Offer Terms and Conditions, your offer of admission requires that you provide a record of up-to-date required immunizations. This requirement must be fulfilled in order to meet the Health Standards set forth in the Public Hospitals Act, Section 4.2, Ontario Regulation 518/88. Please upload your completed immunization form to your personal OneDrive link.

3) Basic Cardiac Life Support Certification (September 5, 2023)

The Basic Life Support Provider (BLS) certification is required for the <u>second year of the program</u> <u>prior to the start of your clinical rotations (September, 2023)</u>. Should you have already completed this, you will be required to take the re-certification course. It is your responsibility to ensure your certificate will remain valid for the clinical year. You can look for courses offering this certificate through <u>Heart and Stroke</u> and the <u>Canadian Red Cross</u>. Once complete, you will be able to upload it into our student-based platform (MEDSIS) that is used for the clinical year. You will be given access to MEDSIS once the 2022-2023 academic year begins.

4) Student Declaration of Understanding for Insurance (due by August 12, 2022)

BScPA students are eligible for Workplace Safety Insurance Board (WSIB) coverage of claims while on unpaid placements as required by the Program. Private insurance will be provided should the required unpaid placement take place with an employer who is not covered by WSIB.

The Ministry of Training, Colleges and Universities ensures that students on work placements receive WSIB for placement employers who have WSIB coverage, and private insurance for employers who are not covered by WSIB for injuries or disease incurred while fulfilling the requirements of their placement. Please complete the form: "Student Declaration of Understanding



for Insurance Workplace Safety and Insurance Board or Private Insurance Coverage Unpaid Student Trainees in Clinical Placements" available in the Appendices, and upload it to your personal OneDrive link.

5) Sharing of Information and Media Release (due by August 12, 2022)

Although you will be a University of Toronto student in the Department of Family and Community Medicine in the Temerty Faculty of Medicine, the BScPA Physician Assistant Professional Degree Program is delivered in collaboration with the University of Toronto (U of T), NOSM University (NOSM U), and The Michener Institute for Education at UHN (Michener). Together, these three institutions form the Consortium of PA Education. As a student in the BScPA Program, your contact information (name, email, address) will be shared, as necessary, within the Consortium for the purposes of the administration of the BScPA Program.

Please review the Media Release forms from U of T, Michener, and NOSM U available in the Appendices. You are asked to consent to the release of your image for various promotions and public relations endeavors as we promote the Consortium of PA Education. Each institution (U of T, Michener, and NOSM U) has a specific media release consent form. Please sign each form and upload them to your personal OneDrive link.

Online Modules (due by August 12, 2022)

a) Worker Health and Safety Awareness module

As a PA student, you are required to complete the <u>Worker Health and Safety Awareness</u> module to ensure that you are able to:

- cite your rights and responsibilities as a PA student under Ontario's Occupational Health and Safety Act
- describe how injuries and illnesses can be prevented by following workplace safety.

You must upload your 'Proof of Completion' document to your personal OneDrive link.

Before uploading the completed form:

 - o last name, first name WHSA (e.g., Smith, Percy WHSA)
 - a single PDF document

b) Working Together: The Code and the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA) module

As a PA student, you are required to complete the <u>AODA module</u> to ensure that you are able to:

- describe how the Ontario Human Rights Code and the AODA are in place to remove and prevent any barriers for people with disabilities
- cite individuals' rights
- explain how the organizations are required to make accommodations

TCARD, UTORid & EMAIL

UofT STUDENT ACCESS

TCard

Your permanent University of Toronto TCard is a photo ID smartcard, which can be used for the following:

- As an on-campus identification card
- As a library card (visit the online library guide for more info)
- For printing and photocopying
- To gain access to University of Toronto facilities such as athletic facilities
- To carry a cash value for food and <u>University of Toronto Bookstore</u> purchases through the <u>TCard+</u> program

How to Get Your TCard + UTORid

- 1. Confirm documentation needed to upload using our new Documentation tool
- 2. Submit photo + documentation online
- 3. Approval email will be sent to student with instructions on how to convert JOINid to a UTORid
- 4. *When on campus, students can book an appointment to pick up their TCard

 *The PA Program will block off some time for you to make an appointment with the TCard office
 on the St. George campus during the September campus block. More details to follow.

See https://tcard.utoronto.ca/get-your-utorid-tcard/ for details. Please ensure you have completed this process prior to classes on **August 29**th, **2022**.

If you already have a University of Toronto TCard, you can continue to use it. Your TCard is your University of Toronto Identification card for as long as you have an association with the University. There is no need to replace the card if the following conditions are met:

- the photograph on the card can still be used as identification
- the technology on the card (optical bar-code, magnetic strip, memory chip) still functions (https://tcard.utoronto.ca/lost-replacement-tcard/)

UTORid + E-mail

The UTORid is the same as the JOINid that was issued when you applied to the program. The JOINid becomes the UTORid once you register for the program. The UTORid is used to log into computers on campus, to access all academic courses, and to activate your University of Toronto email address. It is also used to access UofT's electronic library holdings. (*Please note that the UTORid will replace the qq code that was used for the Medical Terminology pre-course*).

You will need to book an online appointment with TCard Services at tcard.office@utoronto.ca to receive your activation info, and to get your UTOR email account set up. Once you set up and activate your UTORid, you will be able to create a UTOR account.

Each student is required to create a UTORmail+ account and to record this e-mail address on ACORN (and in MEDSIS 3C when instructed to do so). You will need to have your UToronto email up and

running before the first day of classes (*August 29*th, *2022***)**. Your UToronto email is the official means of communication between all students, staff, faculty members, the BScPA Program, and the university.

BScPA Program Communication

The official method of communication with the BScPA Program is through your UofT email account. However, the UTORmail+ is not considered a secure email for transferring confidential information, including patient information. Students may choose to send their own personal health or other confidential information via the UTORmail+ system at their own discretion. Expectations are outlined in the University of Toronto's "Standards of Professional Practice Behaviour for all Health Professional Students".

BScPA students are expected to reply to e-mail, phone, or other messages from BScPA Program faculty, instructors, and staff in a timely manner (usually within 24 hours or one business day, unless otherwise specified). Faculty will attempt to respond to student emails within 24 hours or one business day, unless otherwise noted.

Students are encouraged to use the course-specific discussion boards for questions or issues that are likely to affect the entire cohort (such as a problem accessing course material), and reserve individual emails to course directors for personal issues between student and instructor.

University Communication

The University of Toronto's "Policy on Official Correspondence with Students" states that "Students are expected to monitor and retrieve their mail, including electronic messaging account[s] issued to them by the University, on a frequent and consistent basis. Students have the responsibility to recognize that certain communications may be time-critical". REQUIRED SUPPLIES

REQUIRED SUPPLIES

Computer Requirements

As indicated on the BScPA Program website and in the Letter of Offer Terms and Conditions, the majority of the BScPA Program is delivered on-line. You are responsible for ensuring that you have the following mandatory requirements available to you for the duration of the program.

Mandatory Software (by August 29th, 2022):

- Operating system of Windows 10, Mac OSX 10.9 (minimum), or Linux-chromeOS
- Office 2016 (minimum)
- Compatible browser
 - Specific browsers have been tested and certified for optimal use with Quercus (Online Learning Platform, CanvasTM) See <u>Supported Browsers</u> for details but note that you should always use the most current version of your preferred browser.
 - Please note: Students must use Chrome for all online tests. Other browsers may be used for regular course work.

Mandatory Hardware (by August 29th, 2022):

- A full computer (laptop or desktop) is required (a tablet alone is not sufficient to participate in course activities).
 - o A laptop is mandatory during In-Person Campus blocks and the Clinical Year.
- High-speed internet
- Webcam (required for Medical Terminology Pre-Course –July 4, 2022 and for Exam proctoring)
- Good quality Headset and Microphone (required for Medical Terminology Pre-Course July 4, 2022)

Many on-line synchronous learning activities will occur in a webinar format. Students will need a webcam, headset, and microphone in order to participate.

Printer

The purchase of a printer, while not technically 'required', is strongly recommended, as there is a large number of documents and notes provided on Quercus that you may want to print.

Equipment

The table below is a list of the required supplies that students are expected to have **by August 29**th, **2022**. CAMPUS BLOCKS

The majority of the BScPA Program is delivered on-line, however, there are strategically placed In-Person Campus Blocks held at the St. George campus throughout the 24-months. The Year 1 Campus Blocks will be held from September 6th-23rd, 2022 and June 12th-16th, 2023.

In-Person Campus Block Requirements

Students will need the items indicated in the <u>Supply List</u> by August 29th, 2022. These items will also be required for all subsequent In-Person Campus Blocks. Students must also bring their laptops and required textbooks to the Campus Blocks.

Name tag: All BScPA students are issued a Consortium of PA Education name tag during the first week of classes. Name tags are to be worn at all times during In-Person Campus Block sessions and in all clinical experiences. Students are also to carry their official UofT identification (T-card) at these times. If you **lose/misplace your name tag, there is a replacement fee**. Please contact the <u>BScPA Program office</u> for further instructions.

Dress code: Students will be participating in simulation sessions and interacting with Standardized Patients during In-Person Campus Blocks. Students are expected to wear their name tag (see above) and clothing that is appropriate for seeing patients in a 'doctor's office'.

In-Person Campus Block Attendance

Attendance at all Campus Blocks is mandatory.

Mask Fit Testing

Healthcare providers must follow infection control procedures, including the wearing of personal protective equipment (PPE) when required. The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care has developed directives for health care professionals to wear an approved respirator/mask when droplet protection is required.

Mask fit test data must be updated every 2 years, or when facial characteristics change because of weight gain/loss or facial trauma. For an adequate mask-to-face seal, learners must be clean-shaven at the time of the mask fitting. Accommodation requests will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

BScPA learners are required to be tested for mask fit prior to clinical placements. The BScPA Program will arrange for mask fit testing for students during the September In-Person Campus Block. The cost for the Mask Fit testing has been included in Student Ancillary fees. The BScPA Program and the Office of the Registrar will NOT keep a record of the students' Mask Fit results; it is the responsibility of the student to upload their Mask Fit details into their profile in MEDSIS 3C, including a copy of their results and the expiry date. Students are also expected to keep the information for their own records.

Computer and Wireless Access during In-Person Campus Blocks

Google Calendar

The PA Program uses Google Calendar for scheduling purposes. You may access the Year 1 Program at a Glance on our website www.PAconsortium.ca under Current Students – Course Calendars. We will provide the updated 2022-2023 calendar in the coming weeks. **Please note that the calendar for the first-year students is subject to change.**

Online Learning Platform - Quercus

Quercus is the UofT reference name for the learning platform at UofT (CanvasTM). Quercus can be accessed using your UTORid and password via https://q.utoronto.ca. Through Quercus, you will access all of your course materials including overviews, assignments, lectures, and links to additional information. A student guide has been provided at: https://q.utoronto.ca/courses/46670/pages/student-guide

All Quercus course shells also have a link to the Google Calendar, where all course calendars are displayed simultaneously. Students may view upcoming assignments, assessments, and deadlines, but are expected to confirm individual course requirements. A detailed syllabus/course outline for each course will be provided in the Quercus course shell at the start of the course.

Students must access Quercus and the Google Calendar for all online classes and In-Person Campus Block sessions. The BScPA Program will send out an orientation for the first week of classes, including readings from the required textbooks. Students are to read all indicated information prior to class.

Program Attendance

BScPA students are adult learners, and it is acknowledged that, at times, a student may need to miss a session for personal reasons. These are considered "Personal Days". Students are to use no more than three Personal Days during each semester. Just as graduate PAs must plan for coverage of professional duties when they are unable to attend work, courtesy dictates that students communicate with appropriate course directors/faculty members in the event that they require a "Personal Day". Notification must be provided through the Absence Notification system. More information has been provided in the Student Handbook, which will be available on the Program website this summer at: http://paconsortium.ca/policies.

Longitudinal Clinical Experience (LCE) Course

The Longitudinal Clinical Experience (LCE) is a longitudinal course in which first year students arrange clinical practicums with allied health care preceptors.

Clinical Placement Opportunities

Information regarding the Year 2 Clinical placements, including placement process, rotation, schedules, and expectations will be provided throughout the Program.

Proctoring of Exams

Students will be writing tests and exams online with "ProctorU", an on-line proctoring system. The fee is \$12/USD per hour for each exam. This fee is paid directly to ProctorU. The program works to minimize

the costs by limiting the number of tests to be proctored per semester. Please anticipate 6 to 10 tests per semester that require proctoring in year 1.

Geographic Assignments for Clinical Placements

The BScPA Program is designed so that students may remain in their home community for much of the Program. During year 2, students are scheduled for 44 weeks of supervised direct clinical contact in rural and urban settings, half of which are in Northern Ontario, and half are in Southern Ontario.

The Home Training Location is typically in the same community as the student's primary residence, should suitable training be available. All students are required to complete clinical placements in both the North and South, to experience medicine in different geographical environments. The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Training (MOHLTC) supports the diversity of training accorded to students with the North/South Swap. To that end, they have committed to subsidize students when they are in their Swap training location. Additional details will be provided prior to the start of second year.
